

AUA opens its doors to prospective students

YEREVAN - The American University of Armenia (AUA) held its first "open house" of the year on Saturday, March 17, to introduce its programs, mission, and admission requirements to potential students and the community at large.

Over 250 potential applicants ventured through AUA's doors into the Mihran and Elizabeth Agbaban Hall, to meet with alumni and faculty members. A special presentation discussed admissions and financial assistance opportunities for AUA students.

AUA is the first university in Armenia to offer student loans, and it is also the first university to offer need-based tuition assistance. "We want very much for all qualified students - regardless of their financial situation - to be able to

study at AUA," said the director of Student Affairs Mary Lackie.

"The Open House is a great time for students interested in attending AUA - either now or in the future - to come and learn more about us. All the departments were represented, so students visited with faculty and asked lots of questions about the programs. It's important for prospective students to know that we have changed many things about our admissions process and deadlines for applying," said Lackie.

The event gave "prospective students the opportunity to get the most up-to-date information," she said.
