
## **AGBU IN ARMENIA**




The RSC, established in 1991, expanded its departments late 1998 to include Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT), Microsurgery and Trauma and Orthopedics. Process is underway to privatize a 120-bed hospital in the Arapkir section of Yerevan to house the four above specialties and proctology. Eventually other departments will be added.

In June, the RSC had one of its most dramatic cases, a three year-old boy was rushed to the hospital after his older brother accidentally cut off three fingers of the child's

hand with an axe. The parents quickly packed the fingers in ice and rushed the young boy to the hospital. After a six-hour successful operation and two weeks to heal, he was ready to go home. He now has full use of his hand.

S ince the opening of AUA, 750 students have graduated from the University with Master's Degrees in Business Management, International Relations, Political Science, Environmental Science, Engineering and Public Health. Alumni are currently working in government, industry, foreign joint ventures, embassies, local educational/health institutions, finance and foreign agencies.
