





The American University of Armenia is founded through the partnership and support of the Armenian General Benevolent Union, the University of California, and the Government of the Republic of Armenia. ◆ Throughout AUA's existence, the University has continued to receive generous contributions from AGBU for its academic success and excellence. ◆ AUA is launched as Armenia's first institution of Western-style higher education with a commitment to quality teaching, research and community service. ◆ The University opens its doors on Armenian Independence Day, September 21, with 101 students enrolled in the Intensive English Program. ◆ Within months, these students move into their respective graduate degree programs in Business and Management, Earthquake Engineering, and Industrial Engineering. ◆AUA's first President is Dr. Mihran Agbabian. Dr. Armen Der Kiureghian and Dr. Stepan Karamardian assume positions as Dean of College of Engineering and Dean of College of Business and Management, respectively.



• The Certificate Program in Teaching English as a Foreign Language to prepare English school teachers is established. ◆ The Environmental Conservation and Research Center opens to provide courses to AUA students and to conduct research. ◆ The College of Engineering establishes the Engineering Research Center and the School for Business and Management opens the Center for Business Research and Development. ◆ The AUA Extension Program is created to offer short courses and training for working professionals and the general public. Since its inception 9,000 people have enrolled in Extension Program courses. ◆ The Student Council is established to promote the general interest and welfare of the student body, to enhance student communication and leadership skills, and to promote academic freedom, responsibility, and excellence.






1993

◆ The University holds its first Commencement ceremony graduating thirty eight men and women in Business and Management, ten in Industrial Engineering, and five in Earthquake Engineering. ◆ The Birds of Armenia Program begins its mission to increase environmental awareness in Armenia. ◆ Several books are published for community education and outreach, promoting birding and local involvement in environmental conservation, including A Field Guide to the Birds of Armenia (in English) in 1997; the Handbook of the Birds of Armenia in 1999; a Reference Map for the Birds of Armenia Project in 1999; and A Field Guide to the Birds of Armenia (in Armenian) in 2000.











The first International project related to Solar Energy in Armenia

• The U.S. Congress allocates \$9.6 million to the AUA Endowment Fund. • The Environmental Conservation and Research Center begins offering a certificate program to second year students who want to include a specialization in environmental research in their graduate studies. • The Digital Library project begins developing electronic versions of classical Armenian literature, which is essential for the preservation of the cultural heritage of Armenia and for making the rich Armenian literature accessible to a broad audience of readers and students. • The Engineering Research Center launches a first-ever international solar energy project to heat and cool the AUA Small Auditorium.
