AUA ESTABLISHES THE TURPANJIAN CENTER FOR POLICY ANALYSIS

The American University of Armenia has received a generous \$1,000,000 donation from the Turpanjian Family Foundation to fund programs in the Center for Policy Analysis and the Graduate School of Political Science and International Affairs over the next five years.

In recognition of this major donation for a five-year program, the Board of Trustees of the American University of Armenia decided at its December 2002 meeting to name the Center the Turpanjian Center for Policy Analysis.

The Turpanjian family's funding will permit us to plan regular policy research and educational outreach activities for policy makers throughout the region.
