



On the occasion of the twentieth anniversary of the founding of the American University of Armenia, I extend my warm congratulations to the university's founders and trustees, to its faculty and staff, to its students and alumni, and to the broad community of supporters and donors throughout the world who have contributed to the success of this remarkable institution. As the third president of AUA, I am honored to join this unique community of scholars, administrators and professional staff, dedicated to the goal of improving higher education in Armenia. It is a pleasure to serve an institution that endeavors

to bring to Armenia the ideals of excellence in scholarship, freedom of inquiry, active citizenship and public service. Coincident with its twentieth anniversary, AUA is about to release a strategic plan for the years 2011-2017 that will call for unprecedented growth, including the addition of an undergraduate program. This will allow the university to admit up to four times as many students per year as we do now, and to admit them at a younger age. At the same time, AUA is reaching out to expand its contacts with government, industry and other academic institutions in both Armenia and the US. It is redoubling its international recruitment efforts, and planning for expansion of its summer offerings and abroad programs. It is exploring new modalities of scholarship for its faculty and researchers in order to encourage interdisciplinary studies, integrate teaching with research and public service, and nurture entrepreneurship. We expect that these initiatives will transform the institution in essential ways over the next decade, consistent with the most important aspects of AUA's mission.

In the years to come, we expect that AUA will become more international in character, with a more diverse student body. We expect that it will offer interdisciplinary majors in a variety of new fields and degree programs ranging from bachelor's degree to PhD. We expect that AUA will have more full-time faculty who will involve students in cutting-edge research worthy of publication in international journals of the highest caliber.

In the years to come, we expect that AUA will have an even larger faculty and research staff who combine excellence in scholarship with public advocacy in

fields such as environmental science, public health, green energy and sustainable business practices. We expect that the university will leverage its intellectual property by incubating small businesses that will inject new vitality into the Armenian economy.

In the years to come, we expect that AUA will be very well known throughout Armenia, the Armenian Diaspora, and the higher education community of Eurasia. It will have an enlarged, active and supportive alumni organization, and a much broader spectrum of active donors. It will have recently completed a capital campaign that will have significantly expanded its endowment. It will maintain its "need-blind" admissions policy and will expand its financial aid programs, so that it will remain the case that we never lose a student because of inability to pay tuition.

In the years to come, we expect that AUA will have an important and everincreasing impact on Armenia's educational infrastructure. It will provide unique new opportunities that will stem the feeling among the country's best students that they have to emigrate in order to receive an excellent higher education. It will also attract many of those excellent students who have already emigrated to return to desirable faculty positions in Armenia.

These are enormous challenges to be sure. They could not be pursued without a skilled and dedicated workforce. It is deeply gratifying to see the enthusiasm and eager anticipation with which the faculty and staff of AUA have embraced the challenges that lie ahead. The days to come will surely be demanding, but this is a moment when all who have been involved in the university can pause to take pride in the accomplishments of this institution, the impact that it has already had on higher education in Armenia, and the promise of an even brighter future.





AUA History at a Glance

The post 1988-earthquake months and years were a time of active involvement by Armenians throughout the United States and elsewhere in the world. With the devastation caused by the earthquake and the signals of a deteriorating Soviet regime, the question was not whether or not to help the recovery process; rather, the pivotal issue was deciding what type of assistance or initiative would make the highest and most optimal impact on Armenia.

It would be impossible to capture, in this brief history, the sentiments, aspirations, and willpower of those few Armenians who vigorously pursued the idea that founding an American University in Armenia would be the most lasting gift to their motherland. It took many trips to Armenia and numerous months of hard work to shape the strategic alliances necessary for organizing and funding the initiative.

The seminal team of Drs. Mihran Agbabian and Armen Der Kiureghian soon grew to include Mrs. Louise Manoogian Simone (at the time President of the Armenian General Benevolent Union), Dr. William Frazer, in his capacity as Senior Vice-President for Academic Affairs and Provost of the University of California system, and Professor Stepan Karamardian (deceased) of UC Riverside.

Long hours and tireless efforts by the formation team culminated in the resolution by the Council of Ministers of the Republic of Armenia to authorize and support the establishment of the American University of Armenia (AUA) and the allocation of the University's main building.

The first Board of Directors was formed with Mihran Agbabian, AUA President Emeritus; Professor Emeritus, Earthquake Engineering, University of Southern California;











Two new programs were added: Teaching English as a Foreign Language certificate program; and the Extension Program offering condensed courses and training, thus extending AUA's reach to the general public. (AUA students with Professors Bruce Bolt and Armen Der Kiureghian on a field trip to the Spitak fault that generated the December 7, 1988 earthquake; Computer Lab; Class of English as a Foreign Language; Staff training on personal well-being)









In the same year, several centers were established: the Environmental Conservation and Research Center to promote research and lead the required introductory course on environmental science; the Center for Business Research and Development to conduct "western-style" research and to offer consulting services to private and non-profit organizations; the Engineering Research Center for research in industrial engineering and renewable energy. (Students practicing in the computer lab; A book in Economics published by the Center for Business Research and Development; Intensive English Program class; CAD-CAM lab.)









1993

The University held its first Commencement ceremony in 1993. The first master's degrees were granted to thirty eight men and women in Business and Management; ten in Industrial Engineering; and five in Earthquake Engineering. (Mrs. Louise Manoogian Simone addressing the first graduates; Dr. Theony Condos, Special Assistant to the President and Secretary to the Board of Trustees speaking at the Commencement; First Commencement Day at AUA; Graduates rejoicing after the Commencement.)










The Birds of Armenia Program is launched to increase environmental awareness in Armenia. Several books were published in future years for community education and outreach, promoting birding and local involvement in environmental conservation. (Madeleine K. Albright, former U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations visiting AUA; Career Day at AUA; U.S. Senator Paul Simon speaking at AUA; Test of English as a Foreign Language.)









In this year, AUA established the School of Political Science and International Affairs, offering a Master of Arts in Political Science and International Affairs. (U.S. Ambassador Harry Gilmore at AUA; The second graduating class with faculty, family and friends; AUA students and faculty; AUA Papazian Library.)









In the same year, the alumni got organized into forming the Alumni Association with the purpose of creating a network of AUA alumni that would collectively support the fulfillment of their individual potential in supporting the development of the Republic. (Dean Armen Der Kiureghian with graduates; Valedictorian A. Hambarian; A group of graduates; U.S Ambassador H.









The College of Health Sciences was established, offering a Certificate in Public Health in affiliation with the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health. The Center for Health Services Research and Development started operating parallel to the Public Health Program providing technical assistance, research, evaluation, and program development assistance to the RA Ministry of Health and international humanitarian and donor organizations. (Signing of the agreement with Johns Hopkins University; College of Health Sciences faculty; AUA Open House; Class in Public Health.)









In the same year, AUA established the Turpanjian Center for Policy Analysis (TCPA) dedicated to conducting multidisciplinary applied policy research on a broad spectrum of contemporary social, political, and legal topics. (Students and faculty working together at TCPA; A group of MBA graduates after defending their Master's project; Public lecture; A view of the general audience of the Commencement.)









Armenia's need for specialists capable of creating the legal foundation and for staffing the institutions that support the needed reforms led to the establishment of the two-year Master of Law degree program. The AUA Law School has fostered major movements in Armenian law, including the reforms to transition to a free market economy and other laws. (AUA faculty meeting, Class in Law; Initiation of collaboration with the RA Ministry of Health; A group of AUA students.)









In the same year, the Certificate Program in Public Health expanded into a full Master of Public Health degree providing health professionals a thorough grounding in population-based approaches to health sector problem identification, investigation, analysis, and managed response. (Graduates of the School of Business and Management; Graduates of the School of Political Science; Students of the School of Public Health; AUA faculty and guests.)

Dr. Haroutune K. Armenian was appointed as the second President of AUA. In the same year, the Legal Research Center was established as an integral component of the Law Department providing access to new publications and Internet-mediated databases covering all areas of relevance to law-based governance. (President Armenian addressing the AUA community, Anti-tobacco conference; Public lecture; Legal Research Center.)

The Master of Arts in degree combined the language teaching. (I and Leval Research Co












The Master of Arts in Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL) program was established to complement the Certificate Program. The degree combined theory and practical skills providing students an opportunity to conduct research in the field of applied linguistics and language teaching. (TEFL students; Public lecture at AUA; Students working in the computer lab; Open house showing the Law Department and Legal Research Center desk.)









In recognition of the trend towards greater use of information technology, AUA initiated a minor in Information Technology under the umbrella of Industrial Engineering and Systems Management. The Program emphasizes the use of computer and information technologies. (The stage on Commencement Day; Graduates; Open House; Computer Lab.)









The minor in Information Technology consisted of a minimum of five courses on such topics as information systems analysis, design of databases, Java and C++ programming, and computer-human interfaces. (U.S. State Department representatives at AUA; Graduates of TEFL; AUA Papazian library instructional resources; AUA's growing library collection.)









In this year, the U.S. Congress allocated \$9.6 million to the AUA Endowment Fund. The Environmental Conservation and Research Center (ECRC) began offering a certificate program to second year students who want to include a specialization in environmental research in their graduate studies. (Commencement faculty and guests on the stage; General view of the audience in the large auditorium; ECRC key staff and researchers; ECRC.)









The Engineering Research Center launched a first-ever international solar energy project to heat and cool the AUA Small Auditorium. The Digital Library project began to develop electronic versions of classical Armenian literature, a project deemed essential for the preservation of the cultural heritage of Armenia and the wealth of Armenian literature and for it to become accessible to a broad audience of readers and students of Armenian culture. (Engineering Research Center staff; Solar energy project; Digital Library project presentation; Digital Library project leaders.)









The Garo Meghrigian Eye Institute for Preventive Ophthalmology (GMEIPO) was established by the College of Health Sciences for the implementation of blindness prevention projects throughout Armenia. The Master of Comparative Legal Studies program started in this year, enabling students from other fields to participate in addressing rule-of-law challenges confronting the region. (Opening of GMEIPO; Patients of GMEIPO; Faculty and students of the Law Department; U.S. Ambassador Lemmon and Mrs. Louise Simone at AUA Commencement.)










The MS Program in Computer and Information Science was launched as an applied program to help students gain the necessary skills required to be productive leaders of the computing and related industries. Groundbreaking ceremonies took place for the new Paramaz Avedisian Building. AUA reached a historic milestone in its institutional development as the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), the U.S. accrediting agency, recognized AUA as a Candidate for Accreditation in November. AUA launched Armenia's first student loan program, which provides tuition assistance to all qualified students. (U.S. Ambassador John Ordway addressing the graduates; Signing of the MOU with San Francisco State University; Graduating students at Commencement; AUA faculty and staff at genocide memorial on April 24th.)










In the same year, AUA held the 8th World Seminar on Seismic Isolation, Energy Dissipation, and Active Vibration Control of Structures. The seminar brought together international academic and field specialists to exchange and disseminate information on new technologies in anti-seismic systems. 

AUA established several scholarships: Turpanjian Family Foundation Scholarship; Stepan Karamardian Scholarship; Arpine and Arda Hovnanian Scholarship; Zaven O. Kodjayan Scholarship; Garmery Benevolent Association Scholarship; Richard R. Tufenkian/Armenian Educational Foundation Scholarship; and Harry Kullijian Scholarship. These scholarships join the existing five, which have provided long-standing support to AUA's best students. (New Student Council elected: President of AGBU, Berge Setrakian, speaking at AUA; Environmental panel discussion; Ladies Karamardian, Avedisian and Armenian at AUA graduation banquet.)









The AUA anti-tobacco campaign reached the RA National Assembly. In the same year, the Speaker of the National Assembly established two awards for AUA students. The Department of English Programs started the Center for Research and Development in Applied Linguistics and Language Teaching. (Anti-tobacco campaign at the RA National Assembly; Mrs. Hranush Hakobyan, chairperson of the NA Committee of Health and Social Affairs speaking on behalf of AUA's anti-tobacco campaign; Dr. Armenian presenting the AUA medal to Sona Hamalian; AUA student carnival.)







AUA hosted the second accreditation team from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and successfully completed the first of two final reviews. The College of Health Sciences hosted the XXVII conference of the Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region with delegates from over 50 countries and five continents. (Time capsule placed in the foundation of the Paramaz Avedisian Building; WASC review process; Public lecture by Dr. Alfred de Zayas; ASPHER Conference at AUA.)









Through the generosity of AUA Board of Trustee member Mr. Vartkes Barsam, AUA acquired the HyeBusiness Suites Hotel, located in central Yerevan, to help meet the University's student and faculty housing needs. AUA became a Certified Test Administration Site for the Educational Testing Service, the organization responsible for tests such as the SAT, GRE, and GMAT. (Mr. and Mrs. Vartkes Barsam dedication day of AUA Barsam Suites; Former U.S. Ambassador John Evans speaking at AUA; Alumni dance; PH public forum.)









AUA became a founding member of the consortium of American-style Academic Libraries of colleges and universities. In the same year, the Turpanjian Rural Development Program (TRDP) was launched, a five-year initiative focused on economic growth through adult education and rural entrepreneurship. The Anti-Seismic Systems International Society and AUA in collaboration with the Armenian Association for Earthquake Engineering, held an international workshop on Base Isolated High-Rise Buildings. (Law class; The former RA Minister of Education awarding medal to Mr. Turpanjian; Launch of TRDP; AMICAL conference.)









Fifty-two doctors and nurses in Nagorno Karabakh were trained in first aid and emergency skills by the Center for Health Services Research and Development as part of the United States Agency of International Development funded Humanitarian Assistance Program for Nagorno Karabakh. (Dr. Knuth of Stanford University at AUA; AUA at Education and Career Expo; AUA's 15th anniversary celebration; Family and friends of graduates at commencement reception.)













AUA achieved U.S. accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, one of the regional accrediting bodies recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. The Board of Trustees of the American University of Armenia Corporation appointed Dr. Lucig H. Danielian as AUA Provost and Vice President. TRDP opened three field offices in Shirak and Tavush Marzes and in Nagorno Karabakh. (MBA class; Accreditation celebration; Playing backgammon at AUA July 4th picnic; AUA graduates working at AUA.)







AUA's Dr. Karen Aghababyan received the UK Whitley Fund for Nature Award for research combining environmental conservation research with education. The Legal Research Center organized a number of legal symposia for the public and provided curriculum development support for Armenia's new Judicial School. The AUA Barsam Suites began operations. (HH Karekin II at AUA; Dr. Karen Aghababyan receiving the Whitley Award; TRDP Conference on development challenges; 2007 graduates).













This year marked the physical expansion of the AUA campus, with completion of the Paramaz Avedisian building (PAB) construction. The Center for Health Services Research and Development started a three-year collaborative project "Epidemiology and Intervention Research for Tobacco Control in Armenia" with the Johns Hopkins Institute for Global Tobacco Control. (The new AUA campus, including the Paramaz Avedisian building; PAB Opening ceremonies; The stage at the PAB opening ceremonies.)








The AUA Extension Program expanded to Gyumri and Stepanakert. Through a generous donation of the Turpanjian Family Foundation, the AUA Digital Library of Armenian Classics completed digitization of 60 major authors of Western Armenian literature, 1850-2000. AUA hosted a faculty-led study abroad group from the University of Redlands in California. A team of first year CIS students won the Microsoft Imagine Cup Armenia competition. The Law Department launched the first LSAT to take place in Armenia. The World Bank Yerevan Office and AUA launched the Knowledge for Development Center. AUA hosted the annual meeting of the Association of American International Colleges and Universities and the meeting of the American International Consortium of Academic Libraries. (GIS Day at AUA; ILACA Conference; TRDP Annual Conference; Students receiving Environmental Science and Conservation certificate.)







The Acopian Center for the Environment convened the first conference in Armenia on the use of GIS and Remote Sensing. TRDP completed training and financial support to the Program's 100th village entrepreneur. The AUA Board of Trustees appointed Dr. Bruce Boghosian as the University's third President. AUA opened the Akian Art Gallery. The Law Department transitioned to a thematic curriculum which simultaneously qualifies students for the LL.M. To celebrate the World No Tobacco Day, the Yerevan State Medical University and AUA convened the first "Tobacco or Health" Conference in Armenia. The Main Building of the AUA was renovated with funding from USAID ASHA. (Export Promotion Conference; President Boghosian welcoming guests at the Akian Art Gallery; Exhibition at the Akian Art gallery; "Tobacco or Health" Conference.)









DEP organized the Armenian Ministry of Education and Science's English Olympiad and hosted a conference on Challenges and Opportunities for EFL Testing. Three MBA students received first place awards in the World Bank's nationwide essay competition. CBRD completed Phase I of the Ministry of Economy's Gyumri Technology Incubator Project.
