## A New Center for Economic Policy in Armenia

The Armenian newspaper, Hanrabetutiun, reports in its 14 April, 1994, issue that a Center for Economic Policy, Research and Analysis (CEPRA) was founded by an agreement signed by Armen Yeghiazarian, the Minister of Economy, Glen Anders, the Deputy Representative for the Caucasus of the U.S. Agency for International Development, and Mihran Agbabian, the President of the American University Armenia.

The agreement was signed on 6 April, 1994, at the office of the Minister of Economy. CEPRA will conduct independent economic analyses of issues pertinent to the development and maintenance of a market based economy in Armenia and will carry out analyses as may be requested from time to time by the Ministry of Economy. The purpose of the analysis and dialogue conducted by the Center is to accelerate the change from a command to a market-based economy in as efficient manner
