The Mission of AUA

The Mission of AUA is to provide university education to students from Armenia and other regions of the world in accordance with the American system and standards of higher learning. Through teaching and research, AUA aims to prepare graduates who will play a constructive role in the social and economic development of Armenia, and other regions represented by the student body. The language of instruction at AUA is English because it enables international communication and makes it possible to establish and enhance economic and political relations within the region and the world.

The exchange between faculty and students is based on intellectual openness. Students are encouraged to formulate critically and creatively their own paths of understanding and pursue diversity in knowledge. As a public service to the community, AUA also provides a program in continuing education.

History of the University

On December 7, 1988, an earthquake measuring 6.9 on the Richter scale rolled through the then Soviet Republic of Armenia, killing more than 25,000 people and leaving 500,000 homeless. The human tragedy and economic devastation shocked the world and opened the Republic to the unprecedented humanitarian and technical assistance from all over.

The idea of the establishment of a university modeled on the American system of education was realized through the efforts of Dr. Mihran Agbabian of the University of Southern California, Dr. Armen Der Kiureghian of the University of California at Berkeley, the late Dr. Stepan Karamardian of the University of California at Riverside, and Mrs. Louise Manoogian Simone, president of the Armenian General Benevolent Union. From the very beginning, the government of Armenia, and specifically the then Minister of Higher Education and Sciences, Dr. Vilik Haroutunian, gave relentless logistical support and facilities. Two major institutions in the United States, the Armenian General Benevolent Union with its financial support, the University of California with its academic and administrative support, helped launch the university. AUA is an affiliate of the University of California.

On September 23, 1991, Armenia declared independence. On the same day, AUA began instruction with 101 graduate students in three departments. Enrollment in 1995 has reached 600 graduate students in six academic departments.

Organization and Administration

AUA is an independent, private non-profit Armenian institution. It is the joint undertaking of the Ministry of Higher Education and Sciences of the Republic of Armenia and the American University of Armenia Corporation (AUAC), a California Public Benefit Corporation organized exclusively for educational and charitable purposes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c)(3).

AUA's Board of Directors consists of nine members. Four are appointed by the Ministry of Higher Education and Sciences and four are appointed by the Board of Trustees of AUAC. The ninth member is the President of AUA who is also the Chief Executive Officer. The Chairman of the Board of Trustees of AUAC is also the Chairman of the AUA Board of Directors.

University policies such as academic admissions, courses and curricula, development and finance are formulated with the assistance of the Deans and Program Directors, as well as with the input of various Board committees.

A Director of Administration, resident in Yerevan, oversees the daily activities of the university. Administrative staff, including the registrar, the administrator of the University Extension, and the head librarian, as well as administrative assistants, secretaries, technicians and other personnel constitute the staff of the university in Yerevan.

In Oakland where the headquarters of AUA Corporation are colocated with the University of California administrative offices, all executive functions are coordinated in the office of the president. A special assistant to the president, the office manager, a secretary, and part-time specialists in accounting and computer applications constitute the US staff.

The Faculty

The faculty of AUA is composed largely of professors from major US institutions. A number of Armenian students are now enrolled in doctoral programs in the US in preparation for permanent faculty positions at AUA. Initially, visiting professors have served AUA by taking leaves of absence or sabbaticals from their universities. A core faculty serving AUA on a more extended basis is beginning to take its place in the academic program of the university. Deans of the various academic programs are responsible for recruitment of faculty.

College of Business and Management

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The College of Business and Management offers a two year full-time graduate program leading to the degree of Master of Business Administration (MBA). The MBA is a general degree to prepare future business entrepreneurs, managers of private enterprises, and government executives. With a strong international orientation, the MBA program is designed to help the future managers interact freely and effectively with the global competitive environment. The curriculum also takes into consideration the unique economic, social, and cultural needs and conditions of the region.

CENTER FOR BUSINESS RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT (CBRD)

CBRD was established in 1992 to help the economic development of Armenia in its transition to a market economy. It carries out organized research and development projects through teams of faculty, local experts, and graduate assistants. Representative projects are a regional economic and business forecasting system; studies in industrial development, privatization, and financial services; serving as a resource for local and foreign firms; and publication of scholarly reports.

College of Engineering

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The College of Engineering offers the Master of Engineering (M.Eng.) degree program in Earthquake Engineering and Industrial Engineering. The tragic earthquake of 1988, which provided the impetus of establishing the university, demonstrated the need for an advanced level of learning in earthquake engineering. The Earthquake Engineering department, which is modeled after a similar program at the University of California at Berkeley, provides the essential knowledge from the fields of engineering seismology, structural and geotechnical engineering, and modern computer methods.

The Industrial Engineering department is designed to prepare graduates with a broad-based knowledge in industrial and operations management, design of human/machine systems; economics and decision sciences; reliability and quality assurance, and manufacturing.

ENGINEERING RESEARCH CENTER (ERC)

Established in June, 1992, ERC is administered by the College of Engineering. The Center's purpose is to conduct basic and applied research for the industrial and economic development of Armenia and the region. It brings together AUA faculty, local scientists and engineers, and graduate students to collaborate on projects that are generated internally or funded by external sponsors. Projects have ranged widely from analysis of earthquake response of high-rise structures to theoretical studies in mechanics, from studies in building code formulations to alternative energy sources. The Center has close ties with major institutions and laboratories in Armenia.



College of Letters and Sciences

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The College of Letters and Sciences was started in 1993 with the establishment of the Karakashian Department of Political Science. It offers a two year graduate program leading to the degree of Master of Arts in Political Science. The program is career oriented and gives the students the broader skills and analytical perspectives to function effectively in government service as future diplomats, administrators, policy analysts and researchers. The academic curriculum is designed to prepare students in two interrelated fields. Those enrolled in the Public Policy program are expected to enter public service as administrators upon graduation. Successful graduates of the second program, International Relations, are to enter careers in diplomatic service.

The program in Environmental Sciences provides support to the educational program of the university by offering courses in Environmental Awareness. Examples of the Environmental Awareness courses are the course in Environmental Risk Management offered to the Industrial Engineering students and the course on Living in the Environment offered to all the first year entering students in all the departments.

The program in **Economics** provides support to the educational program of the university by offering courses in Micro and Macroeconomics.

A Certificate Program in Teaching English as a Foreign Language is designed for prospective or practicing teachers of TEFL who will have responsibility for teaching, curriculum design, developing of instructional materials, and, in some cases, train teachers. The Certificate Program addresses the teaching of English at all levels of instruction in Armenian schools, universities and language institutes.

RESEARCH CENTERS

Center for Policy Analysis (CPA)

This Center, established in 1995, is administered by the department of Political Science. It emphasizes problems in local and regional administration, international law, media and communication, policy formulation, and social safety. Students work with faculty and local experts in defining the issues and in finding optimum directions for implementation. The purpose is to help strengthen the intellectual foundations of the democratic political culture.

Environmental Research and Management Center (ERMC)

This Center was established in 1992. It acts as a coordinator of research by bringing together scientists in various institutes and research centers of the Republic of Armenia with faculty and graduate students of AUA. Ongoing research projects address issues in air and water pollution, endangered species, solid waste, health and the environment.

Center for Economic Policy Research and Analysis (CEPRA)

This Center was established in the spring of 1994 as a joint program of AUA, the Ministry of Economy of Armenia and US Agency for International Development. The Center seeks to foster a close working relationship between Armenian and US specialists in such fields as economics, finance, money and banking, fiscal management and the private sector.



College of Health Sciences

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Beginning with the Spring quarter of 1995, a Certificate Program in Public Health is offered to health professionals providing them with background preparation for roles in the public health sector. Emphasis is on personal skills in basic public health sciences, including planning, evaluation, management, communication, epidemiology and leadership. The curriculum employs a modular framework. Three modules concentrate on core public health disciplines and on building quantitative and analytic skills.

CENTER FOR PUBLIC HEALTH STUDIES

In accordance with the policy of establishing research centers in conjunction with academic programs a Center for Public Health Service is under organization. This Center will addres topics in demography, biostatistics, epidemiology, environmental health, and health service management.

Intensive English Program

Since English is the medium of instruction at AUA, the University offers the Intensive English Program (IEP) to provide applicants with a six month (500 hour) English language course designed to raise their proficiency to the level required to carry out academic work in English. The courses are specially designed to prepare students in expository writing, oral communication skills, group discussions, and reading skills.

University Extension

The AUA's Extension Program serves as the University's interface with the community, including certain targeted sectors in government, academia, and the emerging private sector. The courses, seminars and symposia are not part of the university's degree program and are offered on a noncredit basis. The Extension courses are taught by experts from the academic and professional communities.



University Library

University Library

Since the establishment in 1991, AUA began building the Papazian Library, named after the donor of the library endowment. To date, this library has approximately 10,000 English language titles. The university aims to have a state of the art modern library, organized according to American standards to include automated systems, CD-ROM stations and an on-line access catalogue. The Papazian Library houses the Antranig Antreassian collection which comprises more than 3,000 volumes in Armenian and English, a gift of Mr. Antreassian of Los Angeles.

Students

Students admitted to the university have to satisfy general admission requirements for post graduate work leading to a Master's degree. They must (a) hold a degree from a 4 or 5 year program from a recognized institution of higher education, (b) have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 (letter grade B) or higher, (c) satisfy the English language proficiency requirement, and (d) take the standardized graduate examination applicable to the particular program which they will follow. After graduating from an Intensive English Program at AUA and satisfying the above requirements, applicants enter the degree program as full-time students.

AUA Alumni

The first Commencement of AUA was held in October, 1993. The graduates have since formed an Alumni Association. They stay in touch with the university which in turn keeps up its interest in the careers of its graduates. The following is a statistics of the careers of the graduates of the first two years:

It is noted that students continuing their studies in the USA are either working toward a Doctoral degree through AUA sponsorship or they have received US exchange scholarships for shorter periods of study. They are preparing themselves to become future faculty members and professionals to serve AUA and other institutions in Armenia.

FUNDING

The University budget is approved by the Board of Trustees of the AUA Corporation on an annual basis. Local expenditures in Yerevan are partially supported by a subvention from the Ministry of Higher Educa-tion and Sciences. The operational budget, including the salaries of American staff and faculty, are provided mainly by the Armenian General Benevolent Union, a sponsor of AUA, through donations from the Armenian community of the diaspora. Capital improvement funds have been provided by the US Agency for International Development office of American Schools and Hospitals Abroad. Grants have also been made by the Lincy Foundation and the Eurasia Foundation for special programs of the university. The university's Master Plan for academic programs is implemented on the basis of availability of funds.
