About the lecturer: Professor Zadoian is Assistant Provost at Queens College of the City University of New York, and a member of the Queens College Political Science Department for the past twenty years. He previously served at Queens College as a Dean, overseeing, among other programs, the Ethnic and Area Studies Programs. Professor Hratch Zadoian was born in Romania and immigrated to the United States by way of Lebanon. After serving in the United States Army, he did his undergraduate studies in International Politics at Columbia University. His areas of specialization include the Cold War, Soviet-American Relations, American Foreign Policy and International Relations.

He has lectured widely on issues concerning the former Soviet Union, Eastern Europe and U.S. Foreign Policy In The Post-Soviet Era, as well as on topics concerning Armenia and the Armenian Diaspora. Active in the American-Armenian community, he is presently a member of the Executive Council of the Prelacy of the Armenian Apostolic Church of America. He chaired the organizing committee of the International Symposium on the Kingdom of Cilicia, held in New York in the Fall of 1993 and has been an active organizer and participant in numerous conferences, symposia and other educational activities.
